Our initial objectives were to visit and uplift the saints of Guatemala City, journey to the mountainous village of San Mateo, and find a baptismal site for future conversions. While there are many in Guatemala who have shown interest in the Church, there are currently only two meeting places for The Church of Jesus Christ: Guatemala City, and San Mateo, nearly 4 hours northwest of the capital.


Our first night in the coun-

The search party consisting of Brothers Kevin, Francisco, and Lorenzo left to locate the baptismal site. At one point in their travels, they felt inspired to pull over at a rest stop, where they began to converse with the cashier. Brother Francisco asked the man if he

knew of any open bodies of water in the area. The man directed the brothers to "Fuentes Georginas," a natural hot spring heated by the Volcano Zunil, which dominates the landscape of San Mateo and surrounding towns. Here they found the perfect site.

On Sunday, our group of 33 people departed into the mountains and gathered at these waters to witness our two new brothers, Santos Dominguez and Manuel Martinez, enter into their covenant. Many experiences were shared at the water, including that of seeing a personage of light

appear with both of our new brothers along with ministers Jim Draskovich and Kevin Murphy during the baptisms. As Brother Brandon Dulisse spoke to the group about the waters of Mormon and the charge that Alma gave to the congregation, a vision was shared of a personage full of light, thought to be one of the three Nephites, next to the waters.

Our five-day trip was filled with many more blessings from God as well as a spirit of optimism and excitement for what the future holds for the people of Guatemala.

One day, when she was in her room pondering and wondering, a bad spirit came into her mind with thoughts of suicide. She found herself seriously weighing two options, to die or to live! All of a sudden, as she was looking toward the wall, some typed letters appeared spelling out "THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST." She said that the letters shone like silver, and over the middle of these letters she saw her husband, smiling and waving a hand as if to signal, 'stop and wait.' The vision broke the evil thoughts she was having about suicide.

He vowed to leave the three women he had married. The sister and her husband are now staying together very happily, and not only that, but the husband has also started to attend our Church.

NEED FOR ASSISTANCE IN CHINGOLA

The Chingola Branch has been renting schoolrooms to hold Sunday services in for a number of years. This branch is growing; visitors attend every worship service, and this branch has recently organized a choir because of their enthusiasm and excitement about The Church of Jesus Christ. Now, however, the branch has a big problem. The School Board continues raising their rent and is demanding that our Church provide funds to install gates at each classroom, to buy paint for the classrooms, and, most recently, to repair their buildings.

Our operating budget cannot provide sufficient funds

to meet these requests. The demand by the School Board for funds has been a challenge to this branch. Now the School Board has presented the pastor and membership of the Chingola Branch with an ultimatum to either provide the funds requested, or vacate the premises and worship elsewhere. This congregation currently has no choice but to pay, because there is no other place available to hold worship services in that locale. I cannot imagine how the brothers and sisters

they were left without a place to meet and worship God if we could assist in providing a place for them. It would certainly be discouraging and hurtful to them. We cannot lose this congregation of dedicated Saints.

The brothers of the Chingola Branch have tried for a number of years without success to locate another place to rent and conduct worship services. Recently, the brothers, together with our Church President of that mission field, recently located a lot with a vacant building, owned by the local village, that could be used as a worship hall in which of this branch would feel if to conduct church services.

The brothers requested from the local municipal officers, if the Church were to purchase this land, to be given an Occupancy Permit to hold worship services there. The village provided a document to the Chingola congregation to that effect, a copy of which they have forwarded to the parent Church in the US. Purchasing this property for US \$8,000.00 would allow our brothers and sisters in Chingola to have a place to worship God in that would belong to the Church, solving their rental worries. Would you consider our appeal for a donation in any amount, so that we may buy this property for

our Brothers and Sisters of this Branch? It would be greatly appreciated by this thriving group of saints. Please help!!!
